Sir Mortimer Wheeler at Maiden Castle - Chris Copson

For a period in the later 1930s, Dorchester was the focus of archaeological activity on a scale never seen here before or since. From 1935-7 Dr Mortimer Wheeler carried out the only large-scale excavation of Maiden Castle yet undertaken. At the same time, the Curator of the County Museum, Lt. Col. C.D.D. Drew, excavated the Roman town house and associated features in Colliton Park.



Mumming Plays – Jerry Bird

The tradition of mumming, found throughout Europe, but most commonly in the British Isles, dates back to the mediaeval period. Now most often performed at Christmas by morris sides, the mumming play features stock characters such as St George, Bold Slasher, a Dragon and a Doctor, who was able to resurrect the dead.

Thursday February 27th

My Family and Other Smugglers - Roger Guttridge Roger's talk is inspired by family legends and documents about his maternal ancestors, who led one of North Dorset's notorious smuggling bands in the C18th and C19th. He sets their adventures in the context of a major, but illegal, industry that flourished for over 100 years.

Thursday March 26th

The Fox-Strangways a Dorset family - Jane Ferentzi-Sheppard

The Fox-Strangways family is a major Dorset landowner and was was awarded the title of Earls of Ilchester in 1756. Among their holdings is Abbotsbury, where the sub-tropical gardens now occupy the site of the demolished Castle.

Thursday April 30th

The Kitchen is the Key to Victory - Professor Karen Hunt

The First World War was the first "total war" which mobilised civilians as well as military personnel to fight on the inextricably linked war and home fronts. The battle on the home front focussed on a new weapon of war: food, which was wielded by women in their own homes. Indeed it was argued that the Kitchen was the Key to Victory. This talk explores what this meant for Bridport and its women - their resilience and inventiveness.

Thursday May 28th

Dorchester's Georgian Architecture - Ian Gosling Ian's lecture arose from a Civic Society project to photograph all of Dorchester's 282 listed buildings and checking on their conservation. He is hoping to assist in the establishment of a data base of historic buildings, photographs and their history.
