

A New Window on the Past Dorset Archaeology 2025



The Association was inaugurated on 2nd October 1982, with the DNHAS and Museum as its headquarters. The genesis of this new body was the changing functions and funding of committees and central and local government. The Society's Archaeological Committee had formed the Dorchester Excavation Committee in 1968 'to increase knowledge of the history of Dorchester at all periods before the information is lost': the major excavations at Poundbury were only one project. A new County Council and the Dorset Archaeological Committee were established in 1974. In 1982 the Society's Archaeological Committee and the Excavation Committee were dissolved with the intention of setting up a new body to encourage local history and archaeology in Dorchester and the eleven surrounding parishes which surround it. Thus, the Dorchester Association was formed and now celebrates 42 years.
